- the highest point of something, especially the top of a mountain .
- An official meeting or series of meetings between the leaders of two or more governments at which they discuss important matters.

summit

Used in a sentence:

- •We reached the summit at noon.
- •This path leads to the summit.
- On exam results day , he felt had reached the summit of his GCSE's.
- •They held a climate summit in Glasgow
- He was going to an important summit conference

Etymology and historical meaning of the term summit:

late Middle English (in the general sense 'top part'): from Old French *somete*, from *som* 'top', from Latin *summum*, neuter of *summus* 'highest'.

Adjective: annual, regular, crisis

Verb: call, convene, have

Noun: conference, meeting, talks

Preposition: at the summit, summit between, summit in ...
