## Used in a sentence:

- *the increase in revision and the consequent increase in higher grades.*
- **consequent on/upon something**  
*the responsibilities consequent upon the arrival of a new student in the class*

## Etymology and historical meaning of the term **consequent**:

late Middle English: via Old French from Latin *consequent-* 'overtaking, following closely', from the verb *consequi*.

**Noun:** consequence (s)

**Adjective:** consequent

**Adjective:** consequential

**Adverb:** consequentially
