COVID-19 Arrangements for next Academic Year

From September 2022, we will introduce a policy of **no face coverings** unless there is a change of national guidance on safety measures. Simply, the wearing of face coverings does not allow for the best learning interactions to take place in the classroom.

- We will only accept payments by credit or debit card.
- We are an eco-friendly school so, if possible, please bring your own carrier bag.
- The shop will be closed from Thursday 1 September to Tuesday 6 September.

Free School Meals During the Summer Holidays

Parents/carers of students eligible for free school meals will have vouchers issued in two emails, one at the start of the holidays and the second voucher on 15 August. The vouchers will be to the value of £3 per day.

If your child receives free school meals, they are eligible for a voucher for the Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) programme which will be running over the summer. We have issued each eligible family with a voucher which was delivered by email on Saturday 2 July.
