# 100% Attendance & Punctuality

- Letters are sent home after every half term for attendance below 95%
- Letter 1 Target
- Letter 2 Tutor contact and second target
- Letter 3 Parental meeting, contract and final target.
- Students to complete a minimum 36 hours of work a week
- <u>All Y12 students in school for full working days until October data</u>



# 20 minutes late, 3 times a week = 12 lost days!



- All students are expected to use the time they are not in lessons to work.
- Some students will be expected to remain in school for full working weeks if they • are below target or have a low Independent learning score on their report. First report is published in early October.
