1: a standard or principle by which something is judged, or with the help of which a decision is made.

Etymology and historical meaning of the term criteria:

early 17th cent.: from Greek *kritērion* 'means of judging', from *kritēs* 'a judge', from *krinein* 'judge, decide'.
